IPMBA Remembers

Tom Devlin



The Boston College Police Department lost a beloved and valued member of its Mountain Bike unit on Friday, April 6, 2007. Officer Tom Devlin, a 21-year veteran of the Department, passed away after a long battle with injuries he sustained in an on-duty incident. Tom responded to a fire alarm at B.C.'s Edmonds Hall dormitory in September 1988. While helping to evacuate students, he suffered severe lung damage from what was later determined to be a military grade tear gas canister. His lungs suffered further damage in May 1999 when he responded to a fire in another residence hall and was exposed to the smoke while evacuating residents. He was hospitalized again after that incident and was forced to medically retire in 2004.

Tom was one of the original founding members of B.C.'s bike unit as well as an E.M.T. He also took great pride in maintaining the department's fleet of mountain bikes. A former IPMBA member, Tom attended the 2000 IPMBA Conference in Tucson, AZ. He is survived by his loving wife Patricia and daughter Christine.

Leon (Lee) Szczepanski



Lt. Leon (Lee) Szczepanski of the Miami Dade Schools Police Dept. and a member of IPMBA, died of a heart attack on Friday, June 8, 2007, while mountain biking in the Asheville, North Carolina, area with a group of friends. All efforts to revive him by the group members, all of whom were certified IMBA rescue riders, failed. Lee was also trained through that program. He had been the leader of the bike unit from its inception. Lee was about to marry his fiancée Kathy Aguilar and was within a year of retirement. Jim Pierce introduced him to mountain biking and he became a great advocate of the sport and of police officers on bikes.

He was trained by Tony Valdes and hoped to attend the IPMBA Instructor Course. According to Pierce, he would have been a great Instructor, always ready with insightful wit and humor.

Christopher Maclure



On Monday, September 10, 2007, Manchester, England, Police Community Support Officer Christopher Maclure, 21, of Priory Road, Ashton, was cycling through Hindley Green when he was struck by a skip wagon (trash truck). He suffered massive head injuries and died at the scene. Emergency services attended, but were unable to save him. He is the first PCSO to be killed on duty in Greater Manchester. Christopher joined Greater Manchester Police as a police community support officer (PCSO) in January and was stationed at Bamfurlong Police Station.

As a result of this tragedy, all Greater Manchester police personnel with less than one year's experience were banned from riding for a two-month period, pending the results of an investigation. As a result of the incident, departments around the country began assessing their own programs and in some instances began implementing appropriate training programs with the assistance of UK-based IPMBA Instructors.

Chad Schieber



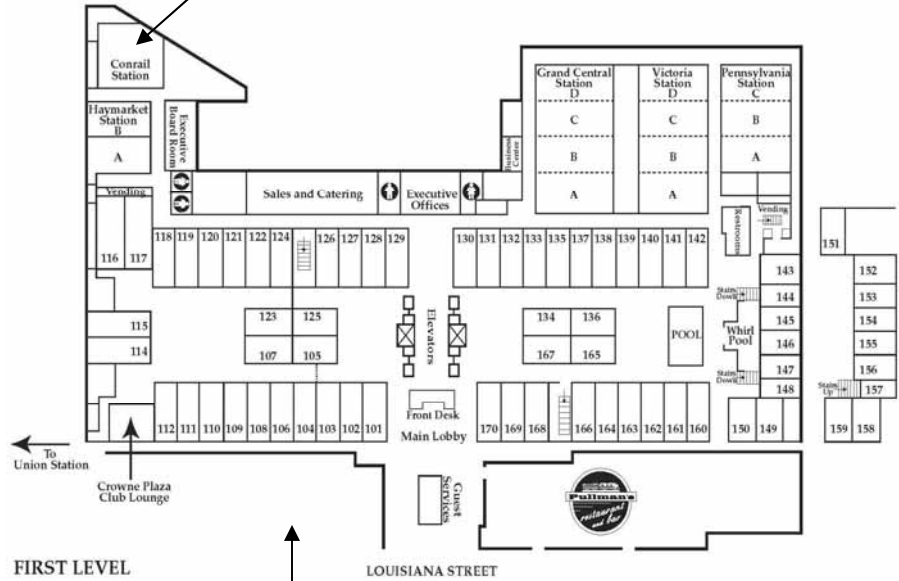
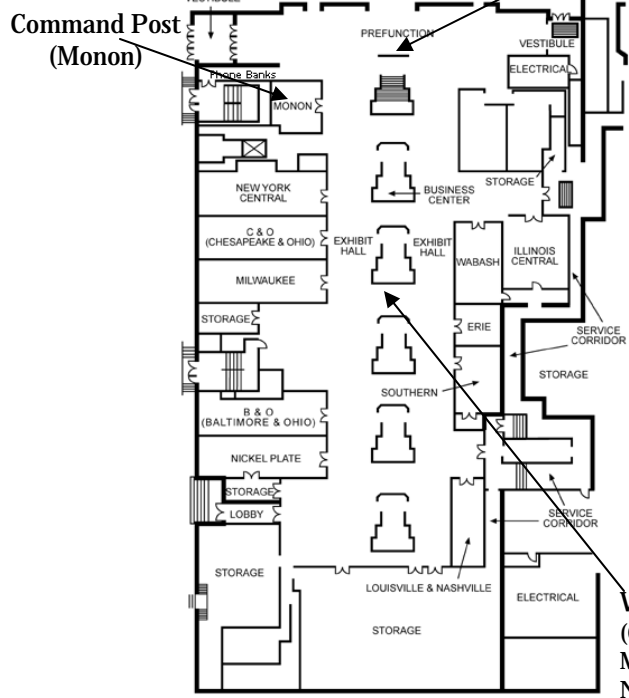
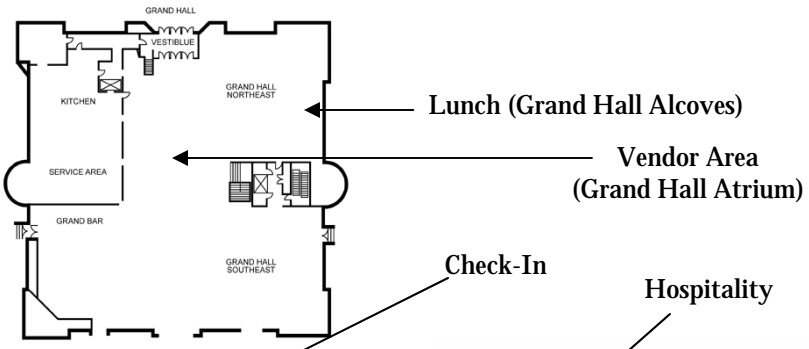
Communities and Police Officers across Northern Michigan mourn the loss of Midland Police Officer Chad Schieber. Schieber, 35, died running in the Chicago Marathon on Sunday, October 7, 2007. An autopsy showed that Schieber had a heart condition where one of his valves didn't work properly. This condition, mitral valve prolapse, is typically not fatal unless coupled with a factor like over-exertion. Temperatures during the marathon reached an unseasonable 90°F, sending 302 people to the hospital and resulting in the cancellation of the run in progress.

Chad, a 12-year veteran of the Midland Police Department, was a bike officer and LEBA Instructor. He was also a former IPMBA member who was trained by Kathleen Vonk in 2000. Schieber is survived by his wife and three children.

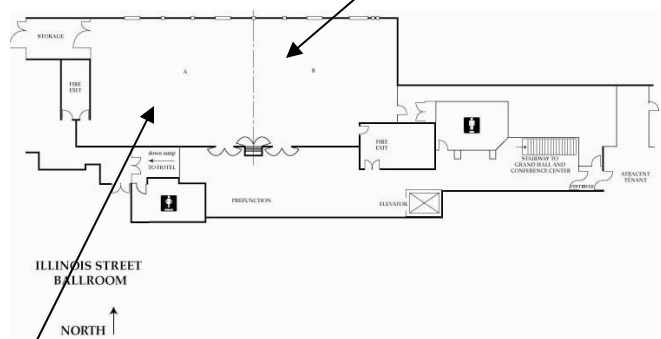
Crowne Plaza & Conference Center Floor Plans

AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION

The IMPD Host Committee courtesy shuttle departure times and a sign-up sheet are posted at the Command Post. Please provide your flight departure time to the Command Post staff. Indianapolis International Airport requires departing passengers to arrive one hour early. Please allow extra time if you are checking your firearm. Please arrive at the shuttle at least 15 minutes early to load your luggage. **You must make your shuttle arrangements at least 24 hours in advance.**

In addition to the IMPD courtesy shuttle, Carey Indiana Limo Services provides airport transportation for \$12 one-way. Bikes cannot be accommodated. Reservations are required and can be made at the front desk.



BICYCLES

The Bike Check officially opens at noon on Friday, April 18, and closes at noon on Sunday, April 27. It will be staffed in the Crowne Plaza from 7:00am-10:00pm Wednesday-Friday; 7:00am-6:00pm on Saturday; and 7:00am-noon on Sunday. IMPD staff will be on call when the Bike Check is closed. **Do not lose your bike claim check. Bikes will not be released without bike claim check or proof of ownership.** *Note: neither IPMBA nor the Crowne Plaza accepts responsibility for the safety & security of the bicycles. Lock your bike!* Bikes are not permitted in public space or meeting rooms unless specifically required for a workshop. **Bikes should not be stored in hotel rooms!**

Bike Shipping: Contact Brian Gootee or Freddie Demott of Gray Goat Sports at 317-780-4828 or bgootee@graygoatsports.com. If you made arrangements for shipping to and from the conference through Gray Goat, the bikes will be assembled by the shop and waiting at the Bike Check. After the conference, the bikes will be delivered back to the shop, disassembled, and return-shipped. If you are shipping your own bike, you will have to disassemble and box it. The hotel will arrange shipping for boxed bikes only. See the front desk.

BREAKFAST

The hotel restaurant serves breakfast from 6:00am-10:00am Monday-Friday and 6:00am-11:00am on Saturday and Sunday, offering continental breakfast buffet for \$8.29 and a full buffet for \$14.29.



CERTIFICATES OF ATTENDANCE

In order to receive a Certificate of Attendance, you **must** complete the Certificate of Attendance Application Form (found on page 33) and have it initialed by the lead instructor of each workshop you attend. You **must** attend a minimum of two workshops on Thursday and two on Friday in order to be eligible for a certificate, unless you are attending either one of instructor transition courses. If you do not obtain an instructor's initials, you will not get credit for attending, even if you pre-registered. Return the completed application to the Command Post or mail it to the IPMBA office within two weeks of the conference. Certificates will be mailed within eight weeks of the end of the conference.

COMMAND POST

"Information Central" – conference details, schedule changes, local information, competition sign up, messages, social activities, etc. **Please direct all inquiries to the Command Post staff. If they do not know the answers to your questions, they will contact the appropriate person or persons.**

The Command Post will be located in the Monon Room in the Conference Center. It will officially open at 12:00pm on Friday, April 18, and close at 4pm on Saturday, April 26. It will be staffed from 7:30am-8:00pm daily, except Saturday, April 26, when it will close at 4pm. IMPD staff will be on call for emergencies at 317-327-3264 (ask for the Downtown Supervisor) when the Command Post is closed.

FIREARMS

Under the provisions of H.R. 218, the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act, police officers are authorized to carry firearms in all states. If you leave your weapon in your hotel room at any time, please store it out of sight. The housekeeping staff will not enter your room if a firearm is visible.

GUESTS

Individuals with GUEST badges will be admitted to Opening Ceremonies, lunches, the exhibit hall, and the post-competition dinner. They are not permitted to participate in workshops, except by special arrangement.



HOSPITALITY

ILEA CREDIT FOR INDIANA OFFICERS

All training at the IPMBA Conference has been approved for ILEA credit. To receive credit, Indiana officers must complete the ILEA form on page 37, bring it to the Command Post for a signature, and turn it into their departments.

INSTRUCTOR TOOLKIT (ITK) UPDATES

Orientation sessions to familiarize current IPMBA Instructors with the new Instructor ToolKit (ITK) have been scheduled for Thursday, April 24, 2:00pm-4:45pm (NY Central) and Friday, April 25, 9:45am-12:30pm (B&O). A demonstration and introduction will be followed by Q&A. All instructors are encouraged to attend all or part of one of the sessions. The ITK will not be available for purchase until after the conference.

INTERNET ACCESS & COMPUTERS

The atrium of the Crowne Plaza Hotel is equipped with free wireless internet access and has two computers for guest use. The IMPD will host a computer station in the Conference Center Saturday-Friday, during Command Post hours. A time limit will be imposed.

MECHANICAL SUPPORT

Mechanical support will be available in the Bike Check area on Wednesday, April 23, 7:00am-10:00am & 5:00pm-7:00pm; Thursday, April 24, 8:00am-10:00am & 5:00pm-7:00pm; Friday, April 25, 7:00am-10:00am & during the competition; and Saturday, April 21, 7:00am-8:30am. During other times, a mechanic will be on-call, and if necessary, transportation to the nearest bike shop can be arranged at the Command Post. Mechanical support will be provided courtesy of Gray Goat Sports and Volcanic Bicycles.

NAME BADGES

All participants are required to wear namebadges during all conference activities. Namebadges are required for entry into workshops, lunches, and the exhibit area. Those with "Guest" and "Exhibitor" namebadges will be admitted to the Opening Ceremonies and the Exhibit Hall only; they are not permitted to participate in workshops except by special arrangement.



ON-BIKE WORKSHOPS

Report to the Bike Check at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled start time to pick up your bike and meet with the instructor. Once you pick up your bike, you will be directed to a staging location where you will meet your instructor and/or guides. If changes are made to the schedule, the Bike Check and Command Post will have the most current information. Sergeant Sammy Davis, U.S. Medal of Honor Recipient
Rank: Sergeant, U.S. Army, Battery C, 2nd Batt, 4th Artillery, 9th Infantry. *Division Place:* West of Cai Lay, Republic of Vietnam, 1967. *Citation:* For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action at the risk of his life and beyond the call of duty. Davis distinguished himself while serving as a cannoneer at a remote fire support base. While the base was under heavy enemy mortar attack, an estimated reinforced Viet Cong battalion launched a fierce ground assault. Davis seized a machine gun and provided covering fire as his gun crew, attempted to bring artillery fire on the enemy. An enemy rifle round scored a direct hit upon the artillery piece, hurling the gun crew from the weapon and blowing Davis into a foxhole. He returned to the furiously burning howitzer. Disregarding a hail of enemy fire, he aimed and fired the howitzer, which rolled backward, knocking him to the ground. He returned to fire again when an enemy mortar round exploded, injuring him painfully. Davis loaded the artillery piece, aimed, fired, and was again knocked down. He loaded and fired three more shells. Disregarding his injuries and his inability to swim, Davis picked up an air mattress and struck out across a deep river to rescue three wounded comrades. Upon reaching them, he stood upright and fired into the dense vegetation to prevent the Viet Cong from advancing. While the most seriously wounded soldier was helped across the river, Davis protected the two remaining casualties until he could pull them across the river to the base. Though suffering from painful wounds, he refused medical attention, joining another howitzer crew which fired at the large Viet Cong force until it broke contact and fled.
