## Michael P. Goetz

November 5, 1955-August 15, 2009

Michael Philip Goetz was born 5 November 1955 in South Charleston, West Virginia. He grew up outside of Buffalo, New York, and graduated from Williamsville High School North in 1973. He was an Eagle Scout and competed at the State level in target rifle.

Mike went on to the Forestry program at West Virginia University in Morgantown, West Virginia. His love of the outdoors was a life-long passion, and although he never finished his Forestry degree, he spent much of his life helping others experience the wonders and beauty of nature.

After serving as a police officer for several years in Morgantown, Mike moved to Seattle and joined the Seattle Police Department in 1984.

Mike served 21 years with SPD, retiring in 2006. Among his many accomplishments during that time, Mike was a strong advocate for the use of mountain bikes in police work, a board member, and a lead instructor for the International Police Mountain Bike Association. He also managed to lead, coerce and occasionally drag many friends, relatives, and colleagues up various mountains around the world from Mt. Rainier to Mt. Kilimanjaro.

During this time Mike also shouldered the duty of caring for his mother, Pat, and father, Hans, from 1986 through their deaths from Alzheimer's in 2000 and 2005, respectively.

Mike married Kris Raymond in 2001, gaining a life-partner and enlarging his loving family. Together they set out to realize their dream of relocating to Africa, where, along with their bed and breakfast in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, Mike would become the first American licensed as a professional guide in that country. Mike's dream was cut short just before completing his apprenticeship when he contracted brain cancer in early 2008. He left us on 15 August 2009 after a fierce battle.

Mike is survived by his wife, Kris Raymond, her children Nichole and Casey and grandsons Caleb and Benjamin. Mike also leaves three brothers, Larry, Paul and Stephen, and a sister, Susan.

In early November, Kris traveled to Zimbabwe to scatter Mike's ashes in Motopo's National Park. He requested to be close to his rhinos, and in a peaceful, spiritual place.

Officer David Haynes was killed in an automobile accident while involved in a vehicle pursuit of a burglary suspect. The pursuit was traveling down Kings Highway when another car pulled out of Oleatha Street and collided with Officer Haynes' patrol car.

The officer was transported to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

The driver who was fleeing the pursuit was subsequently captured and confessed. He was charged with murder for causing Officer Haynes' death, one count of burglary, and one count of felony resisting arrest.

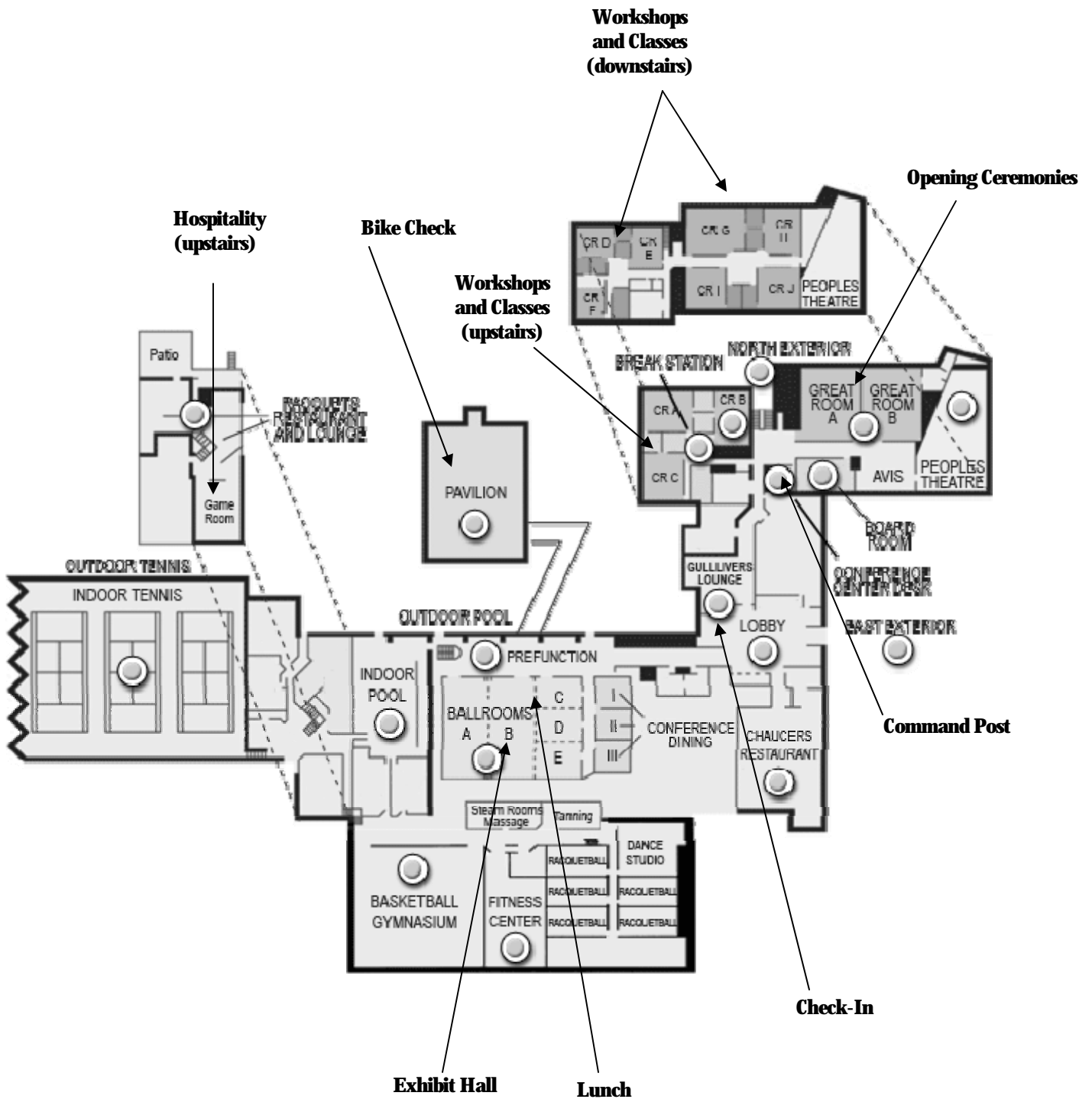
Officer Haynes had served with the St. Louis Police Department for only one year, and had served with the United States Marines before joining the department. He attended the IPMBA Police Cyclist Course at the St. Louis Police Academy, March 1-4, 2010. He is survived by his wife.

## AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION

The SLMPD Host Committee courtesy shuttle departure times and a sign-up sheet are posted at the Command Post.

Please provide your flight departure time to the Command Post staff. St. Louis-Lambert International requires departing passengers to arrive **1.5** hours early. It is a 20 minute drive to the airport. Please allow extra time if you are checking your firearm or your bicycle. Your departure time will be posted at the Command Post. Please arrive at the shuttle at least **20** minutes early to load your luggage. **You must make your shuttle arrangements at least 24 hours in advance.**

The Doubletree also provides hourly airport transportation for \$25 per shuttle, maximum nine passengers. Bikes cannot be accommodated. Reservations are required and can be made at the front desk.



## BICYCLES

The Bike Check officially opens at noon on Friday, April 30, and closes at noon on Sunday, May 9. It will be staffed in the Pavilion from 7:00am-10:00pm daily except

for Saturday, May 8 (7:00am-6:00pm); and Sunday, May 9 (7:00am-noon). Staff will be on call when the Bike Check is closed. **Do not lose your bike claim check. Bikes will not be released without bike claim check or proof of ownership.** *Note: neither IPMBA, the Doubletree, nor the host agencies accept responsibility for the safety & security of the bicycles. Lock your bike!* Bikes are not permitted in public space or meeting rooms unless specifically required for a workshop. **Bikes should not be stored in hotel rooms!**

**Bike Shipping:** Contact Corky Miller, Ghisallo Sports, 636-728-1511 or corky@ghisallosports.com. If you made arrangements for shipping through Ghisallo the bikes will be assembled by the shop and waiting at the Bike Check. After the conference, the bikes will be delivered back to the shop, disassembled, and return-shipped. Leave your bike in the Bike Check and tag it with your name, contact information, and shipping address. **DO NOT** leave personal items with the bike. If you are shipping your own bike, you will have to disassemble and box it. The hotel will arrange shipping for boxed bikes only. See the front desk.



## CERTIFICATES

**Pre-Conference Course Certificates** will be issued at the conclusion of each class on Wednesday. In order to receive a **Conference Certificate of Attendance**, you **must** complete the Certificate of Attendance Application Form found on page 33-34 and have it initialed by the instructor of each workshop you attend. You **must** attend a minimum of two workshops on Thursday and two on Friday in order to be eligible for a certificate, unless you are attending an all-day session. If you do not obtain an instructor's initials, you will not get credit for attending, even if you pre-registered. Return the completed application to the Command Post or return it to the IPMBA office within two weeks of the conference. Certificates will be mailed within eight weeks of the end of the conference.

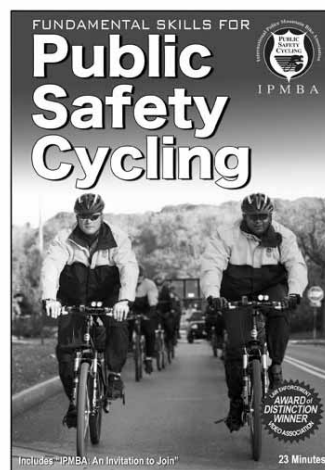

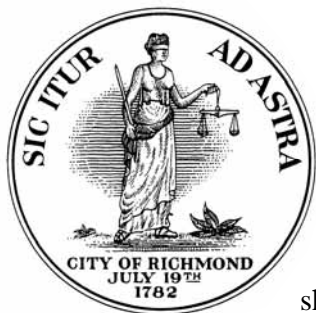

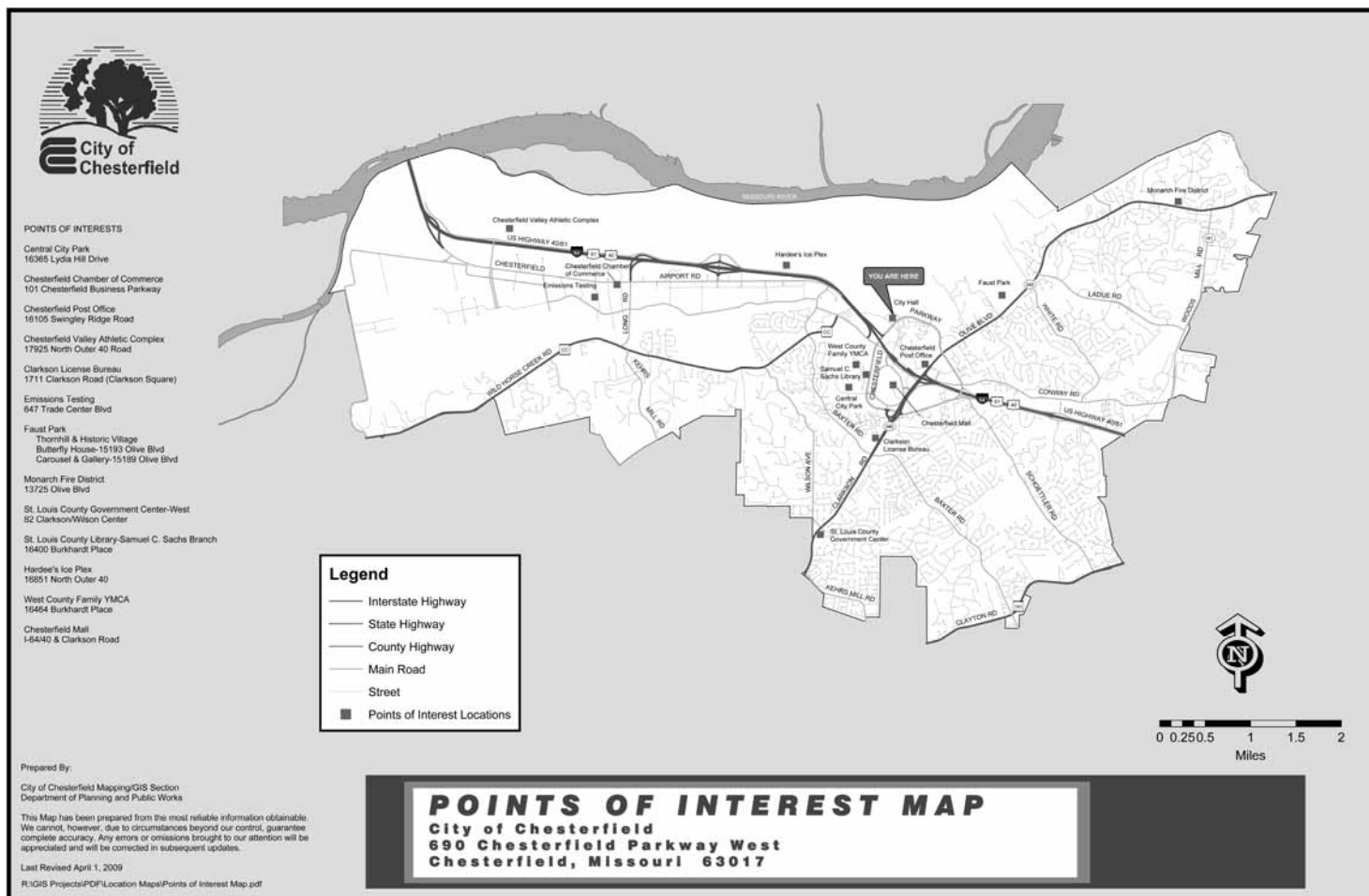
